

DURHAM COLLEGES STAFF CRICKET CLUB

The first meeting of the Club was held on 1st December, 1949.

1. Professor Burchnall was elected to be Chairman of the meeting.
2. It was decided to form a Club to be known as the Durham Colleges Staff Cricket Club.
3. It was decided that membership should be open to full-time teachers and administrative officers of the Durham Colleges and such other persons as may be invited by the Executive Committee. The subscription to be paid by other members should be fixed by the Executive Committee at the time of invitation.

4. Election of Officers.

It was decided to invite Sir James Duff to be President of the Club.

It was agreed that the Treasurer should act as Equipment Manager. He was asked to obtain quotation for the various items of equipment that may be necessary.

The Fixture Secretary agreed to act as General Secretary during the indisposition of Mr. Green.

5. It was agreed that the Executive Committee should consist of -

The Chairman,
The Captain,
The Vice-Captain,
The General Secretary,
The Fixture Secretary, and
The Treasurer.

6. The election of Vice-Presidents was delegated to the Executive Committee.

7. Selection Committee.

It was agreed that the selection committee should consist of the Captain, the Vice-Captain and one other member to be appointed annually.

Mr. T. S. Wetherall was appointed for 1950.

8. The annual subscription was fixed at 10s.0d. and the Executive Committee were asked to consider whether any entrance fee should be paid or whether it would be possible to raise funds in the first instance by alternative methods.

9. It was agreed that, if a summer tour should be arranged, it should consist of two or three matches only.
