1. Apologies

No apologies were received. The Secretary confirmed that all members (26 currently) had been informed of the meeting.

2. Minutes of the last meeting

The Minutes of the 1987 A.G.M. were approved.

3. Matters Arising

Dr. Barber would be asked again if he would be willing to act as Club President. The Secretary would again try to get an entry in the University newsletter "Password" requesting any potential new players to get in touch with either himself or the Captain. It was clear that the indoor net at Maiden Castle had deteriorated further and the President undertook to speak to Mr. Stoker as Chairman of the Board of Management for Sports Facilities to see if anything could be done.

4. Election of Officers

If possible a Vice Captain should be named later this season with a view to them captaining the team in 1989. The Treasurer, in view of his duties next year as Dean would wish to give up his office if a suitable replacement could be found. The Secretary would be willing to take over as Treasurer, but only if replaced as Secretary.

5. Chairman's Report

The Chairman tabled details of last year's results. These were won 4, lost 2. Because of the dreadful weather more fixtures were cancelled than played. The most notable victory was over a strong Odds and Ends side in July at Maiden Castle in which Mike Smith took 5 for 21. The Chairman also commented that there was an evident need for new players.

6. Captain's Report

There was no Captain's report.

7. Treasurer's Report

Match income in 1987 was only £62 because of the limited number of games played, however, this had equally meant wear and tear on equipment was less. The balance in hand at 3/3/88 was £140.44 but some items would be purchased before the new season began. Match fees would remain at £1 per game in 1988. Audited accounts, a balance sheet and an equipment list were tabled.

8. Secretary's Report

A fixture list for 1988 was tabled. Of 13 fixtures only 2 would be at Maiden Castle. At a meeting held at Maiden Castle to allocate pitches for 1988, Mr. Henderson had informed teams that there would be a £20 cancellation charge levied on any team not notifying him before pitches had been prepared where fixtures had been changed. This should not cause any problems to the staff team.
